☐ Chapter 3: 7 Key Factors That Influence Air **Ambulance Pricing**

- Distance Traveled: Longer flights = higher cost.
- 2. **Type of Aircraft**: Helicopters are cheaper than fixed-wing jets.
- 3. Staff Onboard: Cardiologists, neonatal specialists, and trauma surgeons raise costs.
- 4. **Time of Day**: Night flights may have surcharges.
- 5. **Weather Conditions**: Bad weather = risk = higher rates.
- 6. Fuel Prices & Aircraft Maintenance
- 7. Insurance Coverage (or lack of it)

What's Usually Covered:

- Emergency medical transport between hospitals
- Medically necessary evacuations
- Some employer-sponsored plans

X What's Often NOT Covered:

- Out-of-network providers
- Non-emergency flights
- International repatriation

A study in *Health Affairs* found **69% of air ambulance rides are out-of-network**, leading to massive surprise bills.

Travel Insurance Tips:

- Buy policies that include medical evacuation
- Check air ambulance coverage caps (some only cover up to \$50,000)
- Reputable plans: Allianz, GeoBlue, Travel Guard

Chapter 6: International Air Ambulance Cost & Repatriation

Flying internationally? Expect **steep bills**—especially from remote or developing countries.

Average Repatriation Costs by Region:

Region	Cost Rang
Europe to U.S.	\$70,000 – \$120,000
Asia to U.S.	\$90,000 – \$180,000
Africa to U.S.	\$50,000 – \$150,000

Challenges:

- Visa/immigration delays
- Local hospital clearances
- Airport and airspace permits
- Currency conversion complications

Case study: A stroke victim airlifted from Thailand to Houston received a \$127,000 bill. Insurance covered only 50%.
